What The Job Actually Does

Trade jobs cover a huge range of hands-on, skilled roles. These include everything from HVAC technician (installing and repairing heating/cooling systems), to sterile processing tech (preparing hospital equipment), to elevator inspector, lineman apprentice, and water treatment operator.

Most involve working with your hands, solving practical problems, and following safety protocols. Some are highly technical (e.g., neurodiagnostic tech), while others are more physical (e.g., railroad switch operator).

▶ MODULE 09

Beginner Roadmap

- 1 Pick 2–3 roles that fit your interests and physical abilities.

- 2 Search for those job titles on Indeed, state workforce boards, and union sites.
- 3 Check the cert/license requirements for your state (use CareerOneStop.org).
- 4 If a cert is needed, look for local community college or trade school programs (many offer night/weekend options).
- 5 If no cert is needed (e.g., railroad switch operator), apply directly to employers.
- 6 Prepare a resume using the exact job title and keywords from postings.
- 7 Apply to at least 5 jobs per week; follow up with a call or email if possible.

▶ **MODULE 10**

7-Day Action Plan

- 1 Day 1: List 5 trade jobs from the catalog that interest you.
- 2 Day 2: Research pay, requirements, and openings in your area (use Indeed, state job boards, union sites).
- 3 Day 3: Check if you need a cert/license for your top 2 picks (CareerOneStop.org).
- 4 Day 4: Find 2–3 local schools or programs for any required certs.
- 5 Day 5: Draft a resume using keywords from real job postings.
- 6 Day 6: Apply to at least 3 jobs or apprenticeships.
- 7 Day 7: Follow up on your applications with a call or email.

▶ **MODULE 11**

30-Day Action Plan

- 1 Week 1: Complete the 7-day plan. Attend any info sessions for local trade schools/unions.
- 2 Week 2: Apply to 10+ jobs or apprenticeship programs. Reach out to current workers on LinkedIn for advice.
- 3 Week 3: Schedule interviews and prepare using the talking points below.
- 4 Week 4: Enroll in a cert program if needed, or accept an entry-level offer/apprenticeship.
- 5 End of Month: Review progress, adjust your target roles if needed, and keep applying/following up.

▶ MODULE 12

Insider Secrets & Shortcuts

- 1 Referral programs can lead to high-value jobs—one \$200 referral led to a \$30,000 job for a coatings tech (source: transcript). Always ask current workers if their company offers referral bonuses.
- 2 Many trade jobs are posted under alternate titles—search for all variants (e.g., 'HVAC Technician', 'Refrigeration Tech', 'Building Maintenance').
- 3 Some states pay \$5,000–\$15,000 per person for trade school training via grants (see 'WA' grant in Texas). Ask local trade schools about state-funded programs before paying out of pocket.
- 4 AI tools like Claude can help you write job application emails and resumes—one operator copy-pasted ad copy from Claude for all their outreach (transcript).
- 5 For jobs with few decisions (like sterile processing tech or railroad switch operator), the risk of client complaints is low and reviews are easier to maintain. These roles are less

stressful for beginners (source: West Coast Decks analogy).

Interview Talking Points

- 1 Describe a time you solved a technical problem or fixed something under pressure.
- 2 Explain your understanding of safety protocols and why they matter in this trade.
- 3 Mention any hands-on experience, even if it's from a different field (e.g., 'I've worked with tools and equipment as a tile setter').
- 4 Show willingness to learn and adapt—mention any certs you're pursuing or plan to start.
- 5 Ask about the company's training or apprenticeship programs.

▶ MODULE 16

Red Flags / Scams To Avoid

Warning

Avoid any 'trade school' or 'certification' program that asks for large upfront fees without clear state accreditation. Verify with your state's licensing board or CareerOneStop.org. Be wary of job postings that require you to pay for your own tools or background checks before an offer is made. Real employers and unions rarely require payment from applicants.

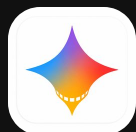
